Since 2010, Scholarship Plus has provided a substantial, fouryear scholarship PLUS individualized support to nearly 80 students — a powerful combination that has helped all our scholars reach their goals. We have a 100% college graduation rate. This is 25% higher than the national average of our scholars' more affluent peers.*

Scholarship Plus scholars confront daunting hurdles — paying

for the tremendous cost of college without taking on loans and navigating life on campuses that lack diversity both racially and socio-economically.We enter their lives before they begin college and stay with them until they graduate — and beyond. We commit to four years so that students can count on the continuity of our support and confidently graduate debt-free.

Students from low-income families (even high-achieving students) are far less likely to complete college than students who are better off – 41% versus 75% In addition to a scholarship, the PLUS includes:

financial advice

We help students obtain the strongest financial aid package possible from their chosen schools and fill the gap in college costs to so they graduate debt-free.

college prep

The summer before college our scholars participate in an orientation program to help prepare them for the transition to and academic rigors of college. Our program exposes them to new cultural and educational experiences in New York City and helps students get to know one another, form friendships, and build a support network.

academic progress

We monitor each student's progress through regular check-ins, and offer advice on academic decisions, tutoring and counseling opportunities on and off campus. Our volunteer counselors are experienced academicians, mentors, and social workers.

employment

We provide a paid internship the summer after high school with our partner, New York Public Radio. Throughout college, we help our students explore summer jobs or paid internships to prepare them for the competitive workplace.

our scholars

100% of our scholars graduate college.

\$21,717 is their average household income.

55% of our current undergraduates major in STEM fields.

95% is the high school GPA of our scholars.

91% of our scholars are first-generation college graduates, changing the trajectories of their families for generations forward and often becoming leaders in their communities.

After graduation, our scholars have entered fields of business, engineering, finance, law, medicine, research, teaching, academic counseling, and public policy.
